## How to Please the Lord

Text: Colossians 1:10

Let us consider some of the scriptural ways to please God:

## L The Walking

"That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing..." (Col. 1:10).

- A. Many people profess to be Christians but do not "walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing" (Col. 1:10). They go their own way and do their own choosing.
- B. Someone has said, "What you do speaks so loudly that I cannot hear what you say." We need to practice what we claim.
- C. We must strive to follow Christ's example in our daily walk, giving Him first place, seeking to do those things pleasing in His sight (I John 3:22).

## II. The Working

..... being fruitful in every good work (Col. 1:10).

- A. Some Christians are remiss when it comes to participating in God's work. They fail to get involved because they are too busily engaged in personal pursuits.
- B. Some are not "fruitful in every good work" (Col. 1:10).

They do their good works for selfish reasons and for personal honor and gain.

C. To please God we must work diligently for His kingdom, doing all for His glory..... whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God" (I Cor. 10:31).

## III. The Wisdom

..... and increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col. 1:10).

- A. Many Christians lack knowledge and wisdom about the things of God. Therefore, they fail to make the spiritual progress they could and should.
- B. We obtain wisdom by "increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col. 1:10). We do this through the knowledge of the scriptures, by study and assimilation of His Word.
- C. To please God we must search the scriptures, find the portions that fit our area of need. Wisdom is promised to those who ask and believe (James 1:5-6).
