"Thoughts At The Lord's Table"

 \Rightarrow **Text**: I Corinthians 11:23-34

⇒ <u>Intro</u>:

• This evening before we participate in the Lord's Super, I want to bring out some thoughts that come to mind at the Lord's Table.

⇒ I. AT THE TABLE THINK <u>BACKWARD</u>

- Someone died for us.
- My friend we are to look to Calvary!
 - "He was wounded for our transgressions."
 - He was wounded.
 - The marks are there.
 - He "bare our sins in his own body on the tree" (I Pet.
 2:24).
- When you lift the cup and partake of the bread, you are saying,
 - "Thank You, Lord, for taking my place upon the Cross and bearing my sins in your body."

⇒ II. AT THE TABLE THINK <u>INWARD</u>

- Do you come "unworthily" or carelessly?
 - "Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord." (1 Corinthains 11:27).
- That is a serious charge.
 - The Apostle Paul says, "But let a man examine himself."

- "Am I truly trusting only in Christ for salvation?"
- Any other heart attitude is unworthy of the Lord's Supper.
- "Have I confessed any known sin in my life and asked God for forgiveness"
- Anything less is unworthy of the Lord's Supper.

⇒ III. AT THE TABLE THINK <u>UPWARD</u>

- There is an interesting fact expressed in these well-known verses.
 - Paul says, "For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you" (I Corinthians 11:23).
 - How could Paul receive any message directly from Jesus Christ if Jesus Christ were dead and buried?
 - Only a risen, living Christ could correspond with the apostle.
 - A living Lord greets us at His table.

⇒ IV. AT THE TABLE THINK <u>FORWARD</u>

- "For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come."(I Corinthians 11:26).
 - I raise the cup to His coming!
 - I eat the bread in faith that I will see Him face to face.

\Rightarrow V. FINALLY, AT THE TABLE THINK <u>OUTWARD</u>

- "Wherefore, my brethren, when ye come together to eat, tarry one for another."(I Corinthians 11:33).
 - The Lord's Supper is a meal of communion, of fellowship.
 - The table is for sinners saved by grace only!

- I thank God for Every other Christian.
- I thank God for every Christian home.
- There is still room at the table.
- There is a place for you.
- Let faith lead you to that place.
