### Gideon, He Succeeded by Trusting God

- ⇒ I. Gideon's Exploits
- ⇒ Read Judges 6:1-7
- ⇒ Read Judges 7:24-25
  - o Compare Judges 6:1-7 with Judges 7:24-25.
    - Notice the plight of the Israelites at the hand of the Midianites.
  - o Read Judges 6:7.
    - The Israelites were in bondage.
    - They were overrun by the Midianites in a land roughly the size of Texas, and they were hiding in caves.
    - Bear in mind, these were God's chosen people.
  - o Then God called a man to lead in battle.
    - We read about his victory over the Midianites in **Judges 7:15-25**.
    - Gideon is noted for the fact that he was the leader of the people who removed the Midianites from the land of the Israelites and eliminated their bondage.
    - Gideon freed a nation!

## ⇒ II. Gideon's experience for the job

- o 1. His family
  - Read Judges 6:25
  - We find he came from an ungodly family.
- o 2. His finances.
  - Read Judges 6:15
  - We find that he was broke.
- o 3. His failures.
  - Read Judges 6:11
  - We find that Gideon had never done anything worthy of note in the past.
- o 4. His friends.
  - Read Judges 7:3,5-6.
  - We find he was surrounded by faithless people.
- o 5. His fear.
  - Read Judges 6:11, 23, 27, 36.
  - We find that Gideon in each of these verses is spoken of as being a fearful man.
  - It would seem that a man with this type experience would never be a success in anything.

### ⇒ III. The Explanation of Gideon's Success.

- o 1. He was willing to trust the Lord.
  - The only logical explanation in spite of all the drawbacks and hindrances to his being a success is that he had faith.
  - In **Hebrews 11:32** Gideon is called a man of faith.
  - He is recounted among the heroes of faith.

- So apparently the reason that God blessed Gideon was, in spite of all the hindrances, all the drawbacks and all the reasons why he should not have been a success, he was willing to do that which the Lord would have him do.
- He was willing to put his fear in the background and do what the Lord said.
- He was willing to forget all of his hindrances and follow the Lord.

# o 2. He was willing to try a new method.

- Who would have thought that taking pitchers, lamps and trumpets and then going out and breaking the pitchers and blowing the trumpets could defeat the Midianites!
- Yet in Judges 7 we find this was the way they were defeated.

### o 3. He was willing to be alone.

• We find in **Judges 7:3, 5-6** that many of the people left him; many of the people departed.

#### **⇒** Conclusion:

- o Gideon had the great requirement for being a successful Christian worker.
- o Gideon was more willing to trust the Lord than he was to trust his own judgment.
