Text: Prov. 24:10

## Intro:

- Most people see adversity as something that is bad and that it should be avoided at all cost.
- But adversity can be useful.
- o It shows you who you really are and what character you have developed.
- o In addition, it helps us to grow stronger.
- When Jeremiah was complaining about the adversity that he was facing, the Lord asked him how he ever expected to face big challenges if the little ones wearied him (Jer.12:5).
- The adversity that we face today is training us for the difficulties we will face tomorrow.
- Adversity can be our greatest motivation for spiritual growth or our deadliest means of discouragement.
- There is no way to avoid all adversity.
- o The secret is how we respond to adversity when God sends it.
- o In order to respond correctly we must seek to understand it.
- The more we can understand adversity the better we can stand against its powerful winds.
- Let me share with you three simple factors regarding adversity.

## > I. Consider The Human Side Of Adversity

- Most people respond differently when adversity comes.
- o But usually those responses will fall into one of three categories.
  - The first response to adversity is to try to remove it.
    - Instead of removing it.
    - We should allow it to reveal our weaknesses.
    - Every one of us have weaknesses that we do not like to talk about or deal with.
  - The second response to adversity is to focus on the outward circumstances.
    - Again we must look beyond the outward circumstances.
    - We need to realize that many times we are dealing with unseen spiritual powers (**Eph.6:12**).
    - It is a fact that Satan can hinder our work for Christ.
  - The third response to adversity is to live by the power of the flesh.
    - If we fight in the flesh, we will fail in the flesh.
    - We cannot win the battle of adversity apart from the power of the Holy Spirit that indwells every believer.

## > II. Consider The Heavenly Side Of Adversity

- o What are God's purposes for allowing adversity?
- o I believe there are ways to many for me to mention in this one message.
- o But let me mention a few and give you the Scripture references.

- First, adversity is God's way of getting our attention.
  - The stiffest competition for our time, attention, and affections are the cares of this world."
  - They choke out the Word of God and drown out the voice of the Holy Spirit (Mt.13:18-23).
  - While we are busy with our plans, goals, and hobbies.
  - God patiently works with us to get more of our time.
  - God's ultimate purpose in getting our attention is to conform us to the image of Christ.
  - On the basis of this, all adversity works for our good (Rom.8:28).
- Second, adversity is our assurance that God loves us (Heb.12:6).
  - Satan will try to convince us that God is angry at us and has forsaken us.
- Third, adversity is God's call for self-examination.
  - God established the regular observance of the Lord'sSupper as a time and place for self-examination.
  - When this is neglected or abused, God will often allow physical adversity to motivate us to do what is right (1 Cor. 11:28-32).
- Fourth, adversity is a reminder of our weaknesses.
  - Only as we learn how to "glory in our infirmities" will we really be able to experience the power of Christ resting upon us (2 Cor.12:7-10).
  - When God works in power through our weaknesses, both we and others are free to give Him all the praise.
- Fifth, adversity is our motivation to cry out to God.
  - God responds to the cry of His children when they are in adversity (**Ps.34: 17**).
  - Adversity motivates us to cry out to God in the right ways.
  - We cry out to God with our voice (Ps.3:4);
  - We cry out to God daily (Ps.86:3);
  - We cry out to God in humility (Ps.9:12).
- Sixth, adversity is God's method of purifying our faith.
  - Faith is essential for living the Christian life.
  - Many times our faith is shallow and weak.
  - This faith must be strengthened to claim the promises of God (1 Pet .1:6-7).
- Seventh, adversity is evidence of spiritual warfare.
  - When adversity takes the form of confusion, suspicion, division and spiritual warfare is on.
  - We must put on our Christian armor and fight back (Eph.6: 11 18).
- Eight, adversity is God's means of testing our work for Him.
  - Every spiritual house and work must be tested to see what it is built of.

- The winds of adversity will bring down a work built with the things of the world.
- We must built our house upon the Rock of Christ (Mt. 7:24-27).
- Ninth, adversity is God's way of sifting our friends.
  - Adversity will always test your friendships.
  - It will reveal which friends are concerned about getting and which ones are concerned about giving.
  - A true friend will love at all times, especially during times of adversity (**Pro. 17:17**).
- Tenth, adversity is our preparation to comfort others.
  - God allows us to experience adversity so we can learn to comfort others (2 Cor. 1:3-5).
- Eleventh, adversity is our signal to reevaluate our priorities.
  - Wrong priorities may result in much painful adversity, not only for us but for all those who are effected by our lives.
  - When we fail to spend proper time with the Lord, adversity will come.
  - Sometimes adversity from 'wrong priorities is the result of trying to do more than God intends for you to do.
- Twelfth, adversity is God's way of identifying us with Christ.
  - Our Lord suffered more adversity than we could ever imagine.
  - When we suffer adversity we are following in His steps.

## > III. Consider The Helpful Side Of Adversity

- The eagle is a great illustration of a Christian flying in the turbulent winds of adversity. (Read -Isaiah 40:31)
- Let me close by sharing some things that turbulent winds can do for the eagle.
  - First, turbulent winds cause the eagle to fly higher.
    - The stronger the wind the higher the eagle will fly.
    - These updrafts cause the eagle to fly at heights that are almost unbelievable.
  - Second, turbulent winds give the eagle a larger view.
    - He is able to see farther than other birds.
  - Third, turbulent winds lift the eagle above harassment.
    - He flies above all the other birds that often cause trouble.
  - Fourth, turbulent winds allow the eagle to use less effort.
    - He depends on the winds to help him.
    - His power comes from another source.
  - Fifth, turbulent winds allows the eagle to stay up longer.
  - Sixth, turbulent winds allows the eagle to fly faster.
    - It is God's desire that we be strong in the day of adversity.
    - The power of the Christian to rise above the pressures, trials, and temptations of life comes from the power of Christ.
    - During adversity, we must rest in Him.
    - May God help us to become Eagle Saints!
