#### RIDING THE STORM OUT

- ⇒ Intro: Acts 27:13-44
- ⇒ Intro:
  - Paul's journey to Rome was filled with danger and the potential for destruction.
    - As they sailed toward Rome, their ship was engulfed in a tremendous storm and they all expected to die at sea.
    - Paul's experiences at sea stand as an example for you and me.
    - As we journey toward Heaven, we sometimes must sail over stormy seas.
    - Sometimes, the sailing is smooth, **v.13**.
    - Most of the time, it is not, v.14!
    - Often the storms that rock our lives seem to threaten the very foundations that we stand upon.
    - Many times, these storms cause us to become discouraged and to want to give up.
    - I believe there is help here for everyone who is sailing one of life's stormy seas tonight.
    - Let's look into these verses and find the help we need to ride the storm out.

## ⇒ I.- v.13-20 <u>A TIME OF DESPAIR</u>

- A. v.13 <u>Deception</u>
  - Calm seas fool us into believing that the storms will not come.
  - But, the Bible says they will
    - Job. 14:1; 5:7.
- B. v.14-17 Disaster
  - When the severe storms come our way, we often feel as if events are out of our control, **v.15**, **17**.
  - Many fall into discouragement and despair.
    - (III. Some of life's disasters)
- C. v.18-19 <u>Decision</u>
  - The storm ought to make us take an inventory of our life and discard anything we do not need.
  - III. Nothing happens to a child of God that He has not allowed to grow us up in Him Rom. 8:28, 2 Cor. 4:17.
- D. v.20 <u>Desperation</u>
  - When there is no daylight in your darkness, you may get to the place where you want to lay down and die.
- ⇒ That is why the times of **DESPAIR** are also:
- ⇒ II. v.29a A TIME OF DANGER
  - o A. The stormy times that we encounter in life have the potential to either make us break us.
  - They will either drive us to seek the Lord, or they will drive us away from Him.
  - What happens in your life is your decision!
  - o B. III. Job.
    - His example is a good one for us. When he was squeezed by Satan, he shouted in the devils face **Job 1:20-22**.
  - C. Simon Peter gave us an example that is to be avoided.

- When he was squeezed by life, he crumbled Luke 22:31-32; Matt. 26:69-75.
- o D. You will either grow stronger, or be dashed upon the rocks of bitterness and unbelief.
  - It all comes down to who or what you look to in times of trouble!
  - (III. Man any man will fail you, you must put your faith in God and Him alone!)

### ⇒ III. v.21-44 A TIME OF DELIVERANCE

- Here is some positive help and hope for your storm!
- A. v.29b Get Anchored
  - Paul tells us they cast out four anchors to secure the ship.
  - They anchored their ship and were still terrified, Paul was not afraid.
  - The reason?
  - He was anchored deeper.
- o Notice four anchors that will hold you in any storm:
  - 1. v.23 The Presence Of God Matt. 28:20; Heb. 13:5
    - (III. The Disciples John 6:16-21.
  - 2. v.24-25 The Promises Of God -
    - His promises are steadfast and true Rom. 4:21.
  - Notice what promises we have to assure of total security.
    - a. Brighter Days Psa. 30:5
    - b. **Deliverance** Psa. 34:19
    - c. Everything is for our Good Rom. 8:18; 28; 32 Cor. 4:17
    - d. Divine Grace 2 Cor. 12:9
    - e. **Ultimate Glory** Rev. 21:4
- III. His promises are based in and on His Word.
  - It is pure, inspired and will stand when the world is in flames, **Psa. 119:89**!
  - 3. v. 24 The Providence Of God -
    - God was working out His plan in Paul's life and He is doing the same in yours!
    - It may be simple faith, but I still believe that God is Sovereign! Psa. 57:1; Isa. 25:4.
  - 4. v.44 The Performance Of God -
    - III. Everyone made it safely to the shore.
    - III. God is able to work it all out!
    - He will get you through your storm and land you safely beyond it!
- B. v.30-40 Accept The Storm
  - III. These sailors listened to Paul and went on with life.
  - There comes a time when we have to surrender to the Lord's will and allow Him to have His way in us.
  - We can either bend under His hand, or he can break us.
  - The choice is entirely ours!
    - (III. You don't have to like, but you do need to submit to God in it 1 Pet.
      5:6; James 4:10.)

# o C. v.41-44 Await Your Deliverance -

- Their storm ended, yours will too!
- Either on this shore, or on that shore, but it will end.
- Meanwhile, submit to the Lord, serve the Lord and know that you are going to make it, **1 Cor. 15:58**!
- God has never and never will lose even one of His little children!

## **⇔** Conclusion:

- o If your sea is rough tonight, I encourage you to cast your anchor upon the solid Rock and make you way to Jesus right now.
- o He already knows about it, but He wants you to depend on Him for your need.
- o Here is where storms are conquered. Won't you come?
