"Things In The Past That We Need To Forget"
Or
"Things That Keeps Us From Going Forward."

⇒ Text: Philippians 3:13-14

- **⇒ Intro**:
 - o V. 13 "...forgetting those things which are behind..."
 - The Apostle Paul is instructing us that there some thing is our past that we need to forget.
 - He expresses this by saying "things which are behind."
 - In other words, thing that have already happen, that are in past.
 - Things that you cannot change.
 - o The reason Paul instructs us to forget those things that have happen in the past because they will hinder us from going forward.
 - V. 13 "reaching forth unto those things which are before"
 - You can't go in two directions at the same time.
 - You can't go forward if you are constantly going backwards or living in the past.
 - o Paul is passing along this lesson to us that he has learned by experience.
 - He says in v. 13, "...I count myself to have apprehended..."
 - Obviously, Paul in the past had tried living in the past and not forgetting those things that he should have.
 - I believe it hinder his work in the Lord until the Lord showed him differently.
 - So Paul is telling us "learn from my experiences".
 - o The reason Paul tells us "forgetting those things which are behind" is because it hinder us reaching our goal.
 - The goal being in v. 14, "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."
 - Serving the Lord according to His will.
 - Fighting the good fight of faith.
 - Finishing the course.
 - Keeping the faith.
 - You see that you can't do that unless you forget those things that have happen in the past.
 - Unless you look forward and not backward.
 - You need to be "Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith".
 - I can here some of you quoting Hebrews 12:2.
 - You need not only be able to quote it but do it!!!
 - o This morning I want us to look at some "Things In The Past That We Need To Forget." Or "Things That Keeps Us From Going Forward."

⇒ I. PAST SINS

• The devil will tell you that God can't use you because of some past sin in your life.

- You need to remind the devil what the Word of God says 1 Jn. 1:7 "...the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin."
- o Notice what the Apostle Paul said about himself in 1 Tim. 1:12-15.
 - Despite his past sins God mightily used him after his conversion.
- o How about the woman at the well in John 4 that Jesus dealt with.
 - She had been married five times and the current man she was living in sin with was not her husband.
 - Despite her past and current sins upon her conversion the Lord used her to bring many to him.
 - See John 4:29-30.
- o So, don't allow the devil to bang you over the head about your past sins.
 - Remember, the Lord can and will use you for his honor and glory despite your past.
- o Even after being saved the Christian will sin.
 - The devil will use that against you.
 - He tell you that you have lost your testimony and you all washed up for the Lord.
 - Again, use the sword on him, the word of God.
 - Remind him of God's promise in **1 John 1:9.**
- o Your situation will probably change because of your sin.
 - Remember, there are always consequences to sin.
- o For example, even though David was a man after God's own heart, his life was never the same because of his sins of adultery and murder.
- o However, God can still use you for his honor and glory after getting right with him.
 - Remember, God is the God of second chances.
 - I.e. Jonah.
- ⇒ We need to forget Past Sins
- ⇒ We need to forget
- **⇒ II. PAST SUCCESSES**
 - o Some Christians are living in the past and resting on past successes.
 - These folks like to talk about their past successes and accomplishments in the ministry.
 - This kind of person likes to have the pre-eminence, because they are always talking about what they accomplished in the ministry.
 - Some times this individual will develop the attitude that they know and you don't.
 - o They are basically living on the memories of the past.
 - This type of person can be a stumbling block to a ministry.
 - Especially, when a ministry is trying to go forward, this individual will keep trying to pull it back into the past.
 - o These folks are reluctant to hear and support new ideas.
 - You see change makes them feel like they no longer have control or in charge.

- o Sad, to say some folks don't even want to see a church grow and take on new members because they want things to remain the same.
- You see that you need to forget the past successes, deal with the present and look forward to the future.
 - Proverbs 29:18, reminds us "Where there is no vision, the people perish..."
- ⇒ We need to forget Past Successes
- ⇒ We need to forget
- **⇒ III. PAST SORROWS**
 - o Christians can get caught up and overwhelmed by past sorrows.
 - The lost of a spouse.
 - The lost of a child.
 - The lost of a parent.
 - The lost of a sibling.
 - The lost of a friend.
 - A Christian can allow grief to overcome them and end up in deep depression.
 - Don't get me wrong.
 - I believe that it is all right and appropriate for a Christian to grieve over the lost of a love one.
 - In fact, if you don't grieve properly then you can end up doing yourself some emotional damage.
 - Grieving is a natural process human beings are to go through.
 - o But if not put in the proper prospective it can keep a Christian from going forward in his service for the Lord.
 - We are told in Genesis 23:2, that Abraham mourn and wept over the lost of his wife Sarah.
 - After he gave his wife a proper burial, then in the next Chapter 24, Abraham sends out his servant to find a bride for his son Isaac.
 - Abraham did allow his sorrow for his wife to overwhelm him.
 - He goes back to the business of life and serving the Lord.
- ⇒ We need to forget Past Sorrows
- ⇒ We need to forget
- **⇒ IV. PAST SLIGHTS**
 - o A Christian has to be careful not to allow past slights from keeping him going forward.
 - Keep him from serving the Lord.
 - o A root of bitterness has destroyed more Christian friendships and churches than anything else.
 - o The word of God tells us about bitterness.
 - See Eph. 4:31-32 "put away"
 - See Heb. 12:15 "defiles"
 - o Notice how the Apostle Paul dealt with past slights.
 - See 2 Tim. 4:16-17
 - Paul was deserted by friends "all men forsook me;"

- He did not allow a root of bitterness spring up and defile him.
- He did not allow past slights to keep him from going forward.
 - Serving the Lord.
 - Finishing his course.
- Notice what Paul prayed there in v. 16, "I pray God that it may not be laid to their charge."
- Our reaction would be "I hope that they get what they deserve!"
- o You, see Paul didn't allow past slights to take his eyes off the Lord.
 - Keep him from going forward.
- You see Paul had his eyes on the "...prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."
- ⇒ We need to forget Past Slights
- ⇒ We need to forget
- **⇒ V. PAST SHEPHERDS**
 - o One thing that has a devastating effect on a local church is when the shepherd or the pastor falls to sin.
 - i.e First church in after saved the pastor fell to adultery.
 - The church eventually ended up closing its doors.
 - As a result, some in that congregation stopped going to church, stopped serving God.
 - Some folks worshipped that man and not the Lord that they felt it was okay for him to continue to be the pastor.
 - A pastor is someone that you should be able to trust in and depend upon.
 - He should set the example for the rest of the church to follow.
 - o The Apostle Peter instructed pastors in 1 Peter 5:3, "Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being examples to the flock."
 - The Apostle Paul told the church at Corinth, "Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ." 1 Corinthians 11:1
 - The key here in this verse is follow the pastor as long as he is following Christ.
 - If he is following Christ, then he is also following the Word of God.
 - When you see the man of God deviating from the scriptures then stop following him because he is no longer following Christ.
 - No just the obvious sins like committing adultery or stealing church funds but the not so obvious.
 - Like using the perverted Bibles NIV, NASB, Living Bible, etc.
 - I think this is obvious but some folks don't Allowing women to take the pulpit as a preacher and be addressed as reverend.
 - o Psalm 118:8, reminds us, "It is better to trust in the LORD than to put confidence in man."
- ⇒ We need to forget Past Shepherds
- ⇒ We need to forget
- **⇒ IV.PAST SHEEP**

- What I mean by past sheep is Christians who have broken fellowship with God because of sin in their life & won't get right.
 - It is a hard thing to do.
 - To have nothing to do with Christians that you once fellowshipped with.
 - However, if they won't get right with God, they are going to pull you down.
 - Keep you from serving God.
 - Keep you from going forward.
 - Especially, if they once attended the church you are in.
 - They are going plant negative seeds in your mind against the pastor.
 - Before you know it you will be start being negative toward the pastor and the ministry of the church.
 - You will end up leaving that church and have the chastening hand of the Lord come down on you.
- o The scriptures tells us we are to separate from Christian who won't get right.
 - See Romans 16:17-18
 - See Mt. 18:15-17
 - See 2 Thess. 3:6
- ⇒ So, we need to forget Past Sheep.
- **⇒** Conclusion:
