## God's Enabling Power

Text: Colossians 1:11

Christians need not solely depend on their own strength. God's omnipotent power is available to them. He can enable them...

## I. To Be Patient

unto all patience (Col. 1:11).

- A. Many Christians lack patience. They want things to happen in their own appointed time and way. They fail to be the blessing they should be.
- B. We must wait on the Lord, accept His timing and mode of answering our prayers. His timing and methods are always right.
- C. We should be patient with ourselves and others too. The scriptures admonish, "in your patience possess ye your souls" (Luke 21:19).

## II. To Be Persevering

..... and longsuffering (Col. 1:11).

- A. Many Christians give up too quickly. When the going gets rough, they throw up their hands in despair. They fail to keep on keeping on.
- B. Persevere means: "to persist in a state, enterprise, or undertaking in spite of counter influences, opposition, or discouragement" Webster.
- C. God has a purpose in what He allows us to endure. He promised, "After that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you" (I Peter 5:10).

## III. To Give Praise

with joyfulness" (Col. 1:11).

- A. Many Christians do not rejoice in the Lord sufficiently. They wear sad expressions and possess a negative attitude.
- B. Paul admonished Christians to "rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice" (Phil. 4:4).
- C. Praising brings rejoicing. The psalmist said, "From the rising of the sun unto the going down of the same the Lord's name is to be praised" (Ps. 113:3). Let us praise Him joyfully.
