Say "Yes" to God's Will

Text: 1 John 2:17

Christians need to know and do God's will. The following points should offer help:

I. The Who of God's Will

"The Lord is... not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (II Peter 3:9).

- A. The "who" of God's will are the "whosoever wills." Everyone is included-all can be saved (John 3:16).
- B. We must confess and forsake our sins, repent, believe, and accept Christ as Savior and Lord.

II. The What of God's Will

- ... but understanding what the will of the Lord is" (Eph. 5:17).
- A. Devoted Christians want to know God's will for their lives.
- B. To know what God's will is for us, we must pray, believe, and claim God's promises. ". . . if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us" (I John 5:14). "Make you perfect in every good work to do his will.. ." (Heb.13:21).

III. The Where of God's Will

"I will... that men pray every where (I Tim. 2:8).

- A. Christians should be in a spirit of prayer at all times.
- B. We should pray at home, school, work, and even play. It is God's will that we "pray every where" (I Tim. 2:8).

IV. The When of God's Will

"Having made known unto us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure (Eph. 1:9).

- A. Many Christians want God's will but insist that it be performed at their appointed time.
- B. We must wait on the Lord and depend on His timing. He knows best. It is "according to his good pleasure" (Eph. 1:9).

V. The Why of God's Will

"For it is better, if the will of God be so, that ye suffer for well doing, than for evil doing" (I Peter 3:17).

- A. The "why" of God's will can be the most difficult. We do not always understand the reason God allows some things to come into our lives.
- B. We must wait in faith and know that God knows best. Everything that happens to us has first been screened by God's love (Rom. 8:28).
