Avoiding Apostacy
Basis=Joshua 23:6-16

Intro:

- (1) We are dedicated to New Testament Christianity, restoring and maintaining.
 - -- restoring the faith and practice of the New Testament church.
 - -- dedicating to preaching and living the pure Word of God.
- (2) In so doing we must never forget the possibility of apostacy.
 - -- Apostacy = "an abandoning of what one believed in" "falling away from the pure Word".
 - -- New Testament writers warn repeatedly of this danger.
 - (1) Jude 3 (apostacy creeps in, Jude 4)
 - (2) I Tim 4:1-3
 - (3) II Tim 4:1-4
- (3) How can WE avoid drifting off into apostacy?
 - -- The Israelites faced the same problem just before Joshua's death.
 - -- Joshua gathered the leaders together and warned them of the dangers they faced and how to remain true to God, Joshua 23:6-11
 - -- His plan to avoid apostacy will work even today
- (4) Let's study his 4 safeguards to help prevent apostacy.
- I. The Safeguard of Obedience
 - (1) Joshua warned "do all that is written in the book"
 - -- Joshua 23:6
 - -- "be firm", not tossed about, Eph 4:14-15
 - -- "do not turn to the right or left"
 - -- this presupposes that they have a knowledge of laws.
 - (2) God has always expected his people to strictly observe His laws. (children of Israel in Egypt)
 - -- Cain and Abel
 - -- Nadab and Abihu
 - -- Uzzah
 - -- King Saul and the Amalekites
 - -- Mt 7:21
 - -- Lk 6:46-49
 - -- even Jesus had to learn obedience, Heb 5:8,9
 - (3) If we are to avoid apostacy, we must do exactly as God says (New Testament Christianity requires nothing less)
 - -- don't expect God's Mercy and Grace to substitute for obedience, Rom 6:1
 - -- there is no room for compromise
 - -- are you willing to build your life on the rock?
 - (4) I Tim 4:13-16

II. The Safeguard of Separation

- (1) It is extremely important that the Israelites keep themselves apart from the surrounding nations.
 - -- Joshua 23:7-8,12
 - -- association with them would (and did) result in their destruction, Joshua 23:13,16
- (2) To avoid apostacy, Christians, too, are to be seperate
 - -- Christians are sanctified people = set apart, I Cor 6:9-11
 - -- the church itself must remain as pure as possible.
 - (1) I Cor 5:9-13
 - (2) this we must do (on doctrine, not expediency)
 -- 2 Cor 6:14-18 (Jehovah Witness=Jesus A god;
 instrumental music)
 - (1) what common ground do Christians have with the world?
 - (2) we must be distinctive...be the light for the world to see, John 3:19-21
- III. The Safeguard of Introspection
 - (1) Joshua told Israel to take a long, hard look inward
 - -- Joshua 23:11
 - -- diligent = "done with careful, steady effort;
 painstaking"
 - (2) Comparing ourselves with His Word will help us avoid apostacy
 - -- examine yourself! 2 Cor 13:5
 - -- when confronting God's Word, we must be willing to make necessary changes, Jam 1:22-25 (look in a mirror)
 - -- corrections are always not easy, but are always necessary if we are to walk the straight and narrow path to heaven!
 - (3) We should examine while we have the time
 - -- God will be true to His Word, Joshua 23:15
 - -- He is patient with us, 2 Pet 3:9-10

IV. The Safeguard of Love

- (1) Make every effort to love the Lord your God
 - -- Joshua 23:11
 - -- do not mention, swear by, serve, or bow before any other, 23:7
- (2) Love is the greatest safeguard to help avoid apostacy -- Mk 12:29-31, if we love with heart, soul, strength, mind, then...
 - (1) we will keep HIS commandments, John 14:15
 - (2) we will forsake all other things to serve Him.
 - (3) we will not want a religion to please us foremost.
 - -- genuine love advertises true discipleship, Jn 13:34,35
 - -- love characterizes true Christianity, I Cor 13:4-8a

Conclusion:

- (1) These 4 safeguards will help avoid apostacy
- (2) Let's all resolve now to make these principles part of us.
 - -- strict obedience to God's Word
 - -- seperation from the world and its influences.
 - -- self-examination regularly
 - -- love God...devotion to Him.
- (3) Unfortunately, Israel did not keep Joshua's instructions
- (4) Will we? Our history has yet to be written.

10-7-90 P.M. THINGS WE CANNOT ESCAPE Intro:

In the San Franscio Bay, a twelve acre island of solid rock if found. From 1933 to

1963, site of Alcatraz prison. Hardened criminals confined. Thought to be escape proof.

Yet, attempts were made; some thought to escape to safety. ("Bird Man of Alcatraz).

- 1. Houdini, thrilled audiences with escapes from situations thought impossible. Died in an attempt to escape from shackles while submerged under water.
- 2. Some things which it is impossible to escape. We might be ignorant of these, disbel-

ieve and reject them, but cannot do away with them. Might ignore, neglect, or even despise, but this does not free us from the inevitable.

DISCUSS: THINGS WE CANNOT ESCAPE

- I. PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY:
- A. To God. He has always held men responsible for obeying His will, receiving His grace, salvation.
 - 1. Today, man must come to God through Jesus. "What will you do with Jesus?" He has given his law in order for one to become a Christian: Faith (Jn. 8:24); Repentance (A. 17:30); Confession (Rom. 10:9); Baptism (Mk. 16:16).
 - Each responsible for decision to obey. No one can do this for us. (Acts 2:40)
 May decide to ignore or reject; but does not free from responsibility. (Acts
 13:46)
- B. Each Christian has personal responsibility in remaining faithful. "Working out own salvation with fear, trembling." (Phil. 2:12).
 - 1. Those who endure to end will be saved (Mt. 24:2-13; ;Rev. 2:10).
 - 2. We must not be just hearers, but doers. (Jas. 1:25)
 - 3. Those who are not faithful, will be lost. Can't make excuse that temptation too great, or others did not do enough to help...Inevitable fact we must face.
- C. Every Christian is personally responsible in helping to save souls: both aliens and fellow Christians (2 Tim. 2:2; Jas. 5:19,10).
 - 1. Should realize personal responsibility as did Paul. (Rom. 1:14)
- D. Parents have responsibility in training children.
 - 1. Owe them spiritual training. (Eph. 6:4) Many give children everything but that which is the most important....Concerned with food, clothing, home, money, good education.
 - 2. Never concerned with proper example, Bible study, worship, proper conduct, speech. (see Deut. 6:4-7).
- E. Reason we cannot escape:
 - 1. The all seeing eye of God: Omnipresent—"Eyes of Lord in every place beholding the evil and the good." (Prov. 15:3).
 - a. All things are naked and open to God's eyes. (Heb. 4:13).
 - b. Truth should keep us from sinning; cause us to always watch words, deeds. "Be
