DON'T LOSE YOUR SONG

- ⇒ Text: PSALM 137:1-9
 - \circ $\;$ Singing can be done as an expression of sorrow.
 - The 'Blues' and much of country music depend upon this concept.
 - But when we find singing in the Scripture it is usually pointing to times of rejoicing.
 - It is also connected with our worship toward God.
 - $\circ~$ The problem in our text was that the Lord's people had been carried away into captivity.
 - As a result, they had lost their song.
 - o Many of God's people today have lost their song.
 - They do not have the joy, the excitement, and the devotion toward God that they should have.
 - Following David's repentance, he prayed and asked God to restore unto him the 'joy' of his salvation.
 - It wasn't that he had lost his relationship with God, but due to sin in his life, he had lost the 'joy' that should accompany a right relationship.
 - o For David, it was his disobedience toward God.
 - For Israel, it was their pride and rebellion.

⇒ I. DON'T LET PERSECUTION TAKE AWAY YOUR SONG.

 $\circ~$ A. The Lord reminds us that while we are in this world, we will have tribulation or trials.

- 1. This is the rule of life for a believer.
- 2. James reminded us that we were to count it joy when we found ourselves in the midst of all sorts of trials. See Jas. 1:2
- 3. Peter explained that the trials come to perfect our faith. See 1Pe. 1:7

 $\circ~$ B. Jesus said, "...Be of good cheer; I have overcome the world."

• 1. We face many difficulties and trials in this life, but we must remember this world is only temporary!

• 2. If we are born again, we have the victory through Jesus Christ!

⇒ II. DON'T LET PAIN TAKE AWAY YOUR SONG.

- A. Pain comes in many forms.
 - 1. Physical pain and suffering comes to all of us in our flesh.
 - 2. Aches, pains, weaknesses are a part of our existence.
 - 3. Often the emotional pain and sorrow we experience can take away our song.
- B. God is the God of all comfort. See I Carl: 3-4
 - 1. Pain and sorrow reminds that we need to be comforted, and that comfort comes from God.
 - 2. God uses our pain to prepare us to minister to others.
