FEAR

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Emotions characterize our personalities (Anger, etc.)
- 2. Scripture often regulates emotion--anger
- 3. Fear an interesting emotion (flying, heights, water)
- 4. Bible has some things to say about fear:
 - A. Rev. 21:8 "fearful will have part in lake of fire."
 - B. Prov. 28:14 "Happy is the man that feareth alway."
- 5. Contradiction? No!
- 6. Biblical examples of fear (Gen 3:10; Mt 14:30; Mt 26, Heb 5:7--Christ)
- 7. Different responses to fear
- I. FEAR CAN CAUSE NON-ACTION (Num 13:1-2; 17-21; 25-33; 14:1-10)
- A. Israel afraid to enter promised land
 - 1. They had looked for deliverence (Ex. 13:5--Moses' promise)
 - 2. Land of milk and honey (imagine sadness now)
 - 3. God's power seen (plagues, parting of Red Sea, manna & quail, etc.)
- B. Mt. 25:14, 25 (Parable of talents [5,2,1]) vs. 30 "outer darkness"
- C. Illustration of playing "chicken" on railroad tracks
- D. NOTE result of Israel's fear: Num 14:26-27; 34-35
- II. FEAR CAN CAUSE WRONG ACTION (Num 14: 39-45)
- A. Israel fears God's wrath--40 year decree
- B. Fear is driving force (they had seen God's wrath--golden calf, etc.)
- C. Israel defeated
- D. 2 Tim 4:7-11 (Paul's last letter, second imprisonment--Demas)
- E. Illustration of letter from school

III. FEAR CAN CAUSE RIGHTEOUS ACTION

- A. 2 Cor. 5:10-11 Paul--"knowing the terror of the Lord...."
- B. Heb 12:28-29 Fear God because He is a consuming fire
- C. Fear can bring about obedience!
- D. OBJECTION!! "Fear and love can't coexist! Only a primitive religion depends on fear for its

following!"

- E. Fear and love coexist in earthly realm
 - 1. Illustration of cleaning garage on Saturday
 - 2. Fear more than love causes obedience to my father
 - 3. After maturing, love more than fear
- F. 1 John 4:18 "Perfect love casteth out fear." (perfect--mature, complete)
- E. Eccles 12:13 "Fear God AND keep His commandments"

- A. To Non-Christians
- 1. Afraid to be a Christian?
- 2. Afraid of commitment?
- 3. Afraid of what others might think? Non-action & Wrong action!!
- B. To Christians
 - 1. Are you a fearful Christian?
 - 2. Afraid to tell others of Christ? Non-action & Wrong action!!

PAUL'S SERMON AT ANTIOCH

Intro: Many sermons were preached in the first century. Only a few are recorded for our benefit. So we can just imagine how good these are. Paul's sermon (Acts 13:16-41) before the synagogue in Antioch is a great example. I call it rebellion, rejection, regeneration, and release.

- I) Rebellion vs.17-21
- A) Although God had taken good care of them v.17-20
- 1) Jehovah is a loving God Jn 3:16
- 2) Jehovah is patient 2 Pet 3:9
- B) But they wanted someone else to take care of them, a king 1 Sam 8:5
- II) Regeneration vs.22-26
- A) Raised up a man after His own heart to be their king and to do His will
- 1) bringing the people back to God and life
- B) Raised up a Savior from David
- C) John preached baptism of repentance (return) Mk 1:1-4
- III) Rejection vs.27-29
- A) Jews reject the salvation so graciously extended to them 1 Pet 2:4,7
- B) Ignored the signs and prophecies Mt 12:38
- C) Crucified an innocent man Acts 2:36
- IV) Restoration vs.30-37
- A) Jesus by raising Him from the dead 1 Cor 15:17-20
- B) Without decay, unlike David, and never to die again
- V) Release vs.38-41
- A) Forgiveness is proclaimed Lk 24:47
- B) Freedom from sin Jn 8:31,32; Rom 6:7,18
- C) Which the Law of Moses could not do Rom 8:3

Concl: There is another rejection to notice - vs.46,47 - God rejects the Jews from being His people and has called the Gentiles - Mt 21:42
