## How to Become As Little Children

- ⇒ **Text**: Matthew 18:1-6
  - o Read Matt. 18:3
- ⇒ I. Practice Humility.- Matt. 18:4
  - A. Little children realize they are small and must look up to grown-ups.
    - They are aware of their lack of strength and wisdom.
    - They ask for help and guidance.
  - B. God wants us to be aware of our lack of strength and of our inability to understand everything.
    - He wants us to ask Him for assistance and wisdom –
      see James 1:5
- ⇒ II. Practice Trust Prov. 3:5
  - A. Trust is a wonderful characteristic of little children.
    - They trust their parents implicitly to meet their needs.
  - o B. Many people are trusting in materialistic pursuits and depending on their own abilities.
  - C. God wants His children to trust Him completely to meet their needs – see Phil. 4:19
- ⇒ III. Practice Light heartedness see 1 Peter 5/17/
  - A. It is normal for little children to be light-hearted and carefree.
    - There are exceptions, such as those coming from broken homes, etc.
  - o B. God wants His children to be light-hearted and carefree, too.
    - He is able to bear their burdens **see** 1 Peter 5:7).
- ⇒ IV. Practice Persistence
  - o "Let us hold fast the profession of our faith" (Heb. 10:23).
  - o A. A little child falls many times but he never gives up until he learns to walk.
  - B. Christians make blunders and mistakes, but they should keep trying and refuse to give up.
- **⇒** V. Practice Anticipation
  - o "I press toward the mark for the prize ... " (Phil. 3:14).
  - o A. Children continually look ahead with anticipation.
  - B. Discouragement is short-lived with children.

- They look to the future with hope.
- o C. Christians should look ahead with anticipation, too.
  - They should look for and expect the best to come see John 14:1-3.

## **⇒** Conclusion:

- We now that it a lot easier for a young child to saved then it is an adult.
  - I believe it is for the reason we have looked at today.
- However, I believe after what we have seen today that is beneficial for the Christian to become as a little child by:
  - Practicing Humility
  - Practicing Trust
  - Practicing Light Heartedness
  - Practicing Persistence
  - Practicing Anticipation
