Study on Perish (Lot's wife) Basis=Gen 19

## Intro:

- 1. "He that gives good advice builds with one hand; he that gives good counsel and example builds with both hands; but he that gives good admonition and bad example builds with one hand and pulls down with the other"..Francis Bacon
- There are 2 basic ways to learn from others' example (experience)

a. follow their successes (positive)

b. avoid their mistakes (negative)

- 3. The Bible gives both positive and negative examples.
- 4. This morning study the negative example of a nameless woman
  - a. Jesus referred to her when teaching about the coming destruction, Lk 17:28-32
  - b. Gen 19:15-17, 24-26
- The Bible is full of many stories of faith and doubt. Adam-Eve, Abraham, Joseph, Samson, Elijah

Jews were great storytellers; their history was preserved in them.

Even obscure events were remembered through the telling of stories.

This lesson will draw a few lessons from one of those relatively obscure events.

"about whom we know very little, but from whom we can learn a great deal"

- 5. What can we learn from this woman known as "Lot's wife"?
- I. Lot's wife perished even though she was the wife of a righteous man.
  - 1. Somewhere we got the idea that being close to an important person made us important.
    - (weak hang around strong) (first ladies)
    - a. it may in this world (name a few well known celebreties)
    - b. it means nothing spiritually
  - 2. Association with a righteous man (or woman) will sometimes make us better, but it will not forgive

one sin (language around preachers) a. 2 Peter 2:4-9

b. angels...God; world..Noah; Sodom..Lot; association did not save the angels, world, or Sodom (or viceversa)

Sometimes people gain notoriety for only one incident: John Wilkes Booth, Lee Harvey Oswald

- 3. Demas: fellow-worker Philemon 1:23,24..deserter
  2 Tim 4:9,10
- 4. Some try to go "piggy back" to heaven (free loader) example: wife, preacher, mother, father, etc.
- 5. Remember Lot's wie

II. Lot's wife perished even though she was warned by God 1. The message was plain

- a. she heard
- b. she understood
- (a and b above from God's grace, Gen 19:16)
- 2. The gospel's message is just as clear. How can we not
- understand. John 8:24, 3:16, Mk 16:16, Act 2:37-38
- 3. God is warning you of coming destruction, 2 Pet 3:7-12

4. Will you avoid the mistake of Lot's wife?

- III. Lot's wife perished even though she made an effort to save herself.
- 1. She did leave the city (with a little persuasion)
- 2. But partial obedience is only failure
  - a. Matt 7:21-23
  - b. what if Christ had not completed His obedience by going to Calvary?
  - c. Heb 5:8,9
  - d. what if we believe, but do not repent? Lk 13:3, Act 17:30
  - e. what if we repent, but are not baptized? Act 2:38, I Pet 3:21
  - f. what if we are baptized, but do not remain true to God? Rev 2:10
  - g. Naaman 2 Kings 5:1ff
  - Many of you are making an effort
- 3. Remember Lot's wife
- IV. Lot's wife perished even though she was separated from the city
  - She was out of the city, but the city was not out of her.
    - a. she had friends and relatives in the city
    - b. besides, one little peak wouldn't hurt (maybe she

was over-confident) Luke 9:62

- 2. As Christians, we are to be in the world, but not of the world
  - a. church = called out
  - b. sanctified = set apart
  - (a and b above don't fall back)
  - c. we are to be led by the Spirit, not the flesh. Gal 5:16-24, Heb 10:37-39, Rom 6:16-18,22
- Don't yield to temptation to look back at the world, Lk 9:62
- 4. Remember Lot's wife
- V. Lot's wife perished even though she committed only one sin.
  - 1. she looked back
    - a. what's the crime? disobedience -- rebellion toward God's command.
    - b. one sin is all it took to destroy her.
  - 2. One sin destroyed
    - a. Adam/Eve
    - b. Uzzah
    - c. Nadab and Abihu
    - d. Moses
  - 3. Sinners perish, not because of number of sins, but the fact we sin, Isa 59:1,2 Rom 6:23
  - How many sins have you committed (can you sense the patience of God?)

Conclusion:

- 1. Lot's wife perished even though she:
  - a. was wife of righteous man
  - b. was warned by God
  - c. made an attempt to save herself
  - d. was separated from city
  - e. committed only 1 sin.
- 2. Heb 12:1,2
