- 1. When a person obeys the gospel, he is married to Christ, Rom.7:4.
- 2. Paul speaks of Christ as the head, and the church as his body, Eph.5:25-33.
- A. Wifes are to be in subjection to their husbands.
- B. The church is to be in subjection to Christ, Eph.5:22-25.
- 3. Sometimes members of the church leave their first love, Rev.2:4.
- 4. We need to rekindle our love for Christ.
- II. The Decline of Romance in Marriage
- 1. Experts tell us that in marriage, there are five steps to the decline of it.
- A. Romance.
- 1). Remember how in love you were when you were trying to win him/her?
- 2). You both tried to please the other.
- 3). The same is true when we became Christians.
- a. We wanted to tell others about Christ and his church.
- b. We wanted to attend every service.
- c. We wanted to learn as much as we could.
- B. Reality.
- (1). After the honeymoon, reality sets in. You find the angel you married is an ordinary human being that differes from you in other way than just being a female.
- a. The wife finds the husband has some habits that he didnt express when they were courting.
- 2). After we have been in the church for awhile, we see that everyone is not perfect.
- a. Of course we arent either.
- b. People dont have their lessons, some even forget or have lost their books.
- c. People go to sleep in services, etc.
- d. Members do things which you think they should not do.
- C. Rut.
- 1). In marriage we get use to one another.
- a. We take one another for granted.
- b. We stop trying to please the other, and start pleasing ourselves.
- 2). In our marriage to Christ, we have the same problem.
- a. We go to church, but only go through motions rather than worshipping.
- b. We go to assemble to see what we can get out of it, rather than to see what we can put into it.

- c. We get excited about fights and fusses, but dont show much interest in duty or doing for others.
- D. Resentment.
- 1). Soon, one begins to resent the other because he/she has changed and no longer acts as he/she did when we first got married.
- a. This shows up in negative statements made about the other before others.
- b. The two begin drifting apart in their interests. They becomes strangers living under the same roof.
- c. Some may be husband and wife, but they act more like brother and sister.
- 2). The same thing happens in ones marriage to Christ.
- a. The person begins to pick and pout over everything.
- b. He/she gripes about the preacher not preaching interesting sermons.
- c. He/she gripes about the elders never doing anything right.
- d. He/she gripes about the church being made up of hypocrites.
- E. Revenge.
- 1). The marriage goes in one of several directions:
- a. The couple realizes what is happening and revitalizes the marriage.
- b. The couple lives under the same roof, but live separate lives.
- c. The couple separates and finally divorces.
- 2). The same thing happens in ones marriage to Christ.
- a. He/she begins finding excuses to not be involved.
- b. He/she begins looking for an excuse to quit.
- III. How To Revitalize Our Marriage To Christ.
- 1. Rev.2:5
- A. Remember.
- 1). Remember what you did to win your wife/husband?
- 2). The same is true in revitalizing our marriage to Christ.
- a. Remember what Jesus did for you.
- b. Remember who you are.
- c. Remember what you are.
- d. Remember where you want to go.
- B. Repent.
- 1). The word means to change your mind and go in a different direction.
- a. Return to doing what you did when you first won your husband/wife.
- 2). John told the bride of Christ to return to your first love.
