SEVEN STRANGE PREACHERS

- ⇒ Text: Matthew 3:1-5
- ➡ Intro:
 - When we read the description of John the Baptist in our text we see he was a strange preacher!
 - 1. We see He had a strange message "Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
 - 2. He had a strange pulpit "the wilderness of Judaea"
 - 3. He had a strange from of dress "raiment of camel's hair, and a leathern girdle about his loins;"
 - 4. He had a strange diet "his meat was locusts and wild honey."
 - o Let's notice some other strange preachers in the Bible.
- ⇒ I. Gen. 8:11 NOAH'S DOVE
 - The dove brought a message about the faithfulness of God
 - God was faithful in His promise to Noah Ge. 6:17-22, Ge. 8:1
- □ II. Num. 22:28 BALAAM'S DONKEY
 - The donkey brought a message of rebuke.
 - Balak, King of Moab sent for Balaam to come and curse the children of Israel.
 - Balak promised Balaam great riches and honor.
 - God told Balaam not to go with Balak's men and not to curse the people because they were blessed.
 - Balaam went any way and angered the Lord.
 - See Numbers 22:21-34
- ⇒ III. 1 Kings 17:6 ELIJAH'S RAVENS
 - o The ravens brought the message of Romans 8:28.
 - See vs. 1-6
- ⇒ IV. Luke 16:21- THE RICH MAN'S DOGS
 - The dogs brought a message of compassion.
 - The dogs help relieve the suffering of Lazarus by the licking of his sores
 - The rich man's dogs had more compassion that the rich man.

- The rich man had the means to relieve the Lazarus's suffering.
 - But he did not.
- When the tables were turned the rich man wanted compassion but it was to late.
- o Man needs to seek the compassion of God while he is alive after he is died to late.
- ⇒ V. Luke 22:60-62 SIMON PETER'S ROOSTER
 - o The rooster brought a message of repentance.
- ⇒ VI. Acts 12:23 HEROD'S WORMS
 - The worms brought a message of judgment.
 - See vs. 21-23
 - o Pride brings judgment Prov. 16:18
 - "God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble." James 4:6
- ⇒ VII. Jonah 1:17 Jonah's Whale
 - The whale brought a message of chastisement.
 - o God told Jonah to "Arise, go to Ninevah, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me."
 - Jonah was disobedient and got own the boat to Tarshish.
 - See Prov. 3:12
 - o We see Jonah got right with God.
 - See Jonah 2:10 3:1-3.
 - We know that Jonah preached God's message and that heathen repented of their wickedness and God's judgment was stayed.
- **⇒** Conclusion:
 - As we have looked at these seven strange preachers we are reminded of what the Apostle Paul said in See 1 Cor.
 1:27-29.
