Text: Luke 23:1-25

Introduction:

- 1. Here was a man who was torn between the conviction of his heart and the cry of the multitude.
- His heart said, "He is innocent". The crowd said, "Crucify Him!".
- I. HIS CRUCIAL PRIVILEGE vs. 1, read. "led him unto Pilate."
 - A. A face to face encounter with Jesus will have a lasting effect on anyone.
 - 1. Some will harden their hearts and reject Him.

Heb. 3:15, "To day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts,..."

2. Some will see Him as Saviour and receive Him.

John 1:12, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:"

B. One day all will stand before Him face to face and gave an account.

1. The saved at the Judgment Seat of Chirst not for -See Rom 14:10 salvation but determine rewards will receive or not receive. "All"

2. The unsaved at the Great White Throne - Rev. 20:11-15.

- A. Jesus answered, "Thou sayest it"
 - 1. Matthew 16:13-16 "The Son of God" Real
 - 2. John 3:18 A heavenly king New
- B. The first coming of Christ was to provide salvation but His second coming will provide a King.

1. He will rule from David's throne - Luke 1:30-33.

2. He will rule with a rod of iron. - Isa. 11:4

III. HIS CANDID CONFESSION, vs. 4, read - "I find no fault in this man."

A. Any honest man will have to give the same answer.

I Peter 2:22 - read, "no sin"
Hebrews 4:15 - read, "without sin"

B. If Jesus was a sinner then he could not be a saviour.

1. He would have been a spotted lamb.

2. He would have died a sinner's death.

3. Paul said, See I Cor. 15:12-14: He would not of been resurrection

IV. HIS COWARDLY EVASION - vs. 5-12 - read.

vs. 7, "...he sent him to Herod..."

A. People today are still trying to evade a decision about Jesus by sending Him away.

1. From their minds.

2. From their presence.

3. When the Apostle Paul witnessed to Felix the governor, Felix replied in Acts 24:25, "Go thy way for this time; when I have a convenient season, I will call for thee."

- B. If Jesus thought He was divine and wasn't then He was a maniac. If He pretended to be the saviour and was not then He was a fraud. But if He is who He said that He was then we should receive Him without hesitation.
 - 1. Investigate the facts Paul's testimony. See I Cor. 15:1-7 Centurion's testimony at the cross - "Truly this man was the Son of God" Thomas's testimony after resurrection "My Lord and my God." John the Baptist - "Behold the Lamb of God who taketh away the sin of the world"
 - 2. Investigate His character. He healed the sick, lame, blind, etc. He raised the dead. He controlled the elements - wind, sea, etc. He rebuked the self-righteous. He was tempted but he was without sin.

3. Don't take someone else's word.

V. HIS CONCILIATORY PROPOSAL - vs. 16, read. "I will therefore chastise him, and release him."

A. Pilate thought chastisement would appease the people.

1. His own conscience told him to release Jesus.

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B. Many today are still trying to plan a way to avoid a decision.

1. Some substitute religion and good works.

- 2. Some engross themselves in the things of the world.
- C. The question still remains "what will ye do with Jesus?"
- VI. HIS CONDEMNING DECISION, vs. 24, read. "And Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they required."
 - A. They required crucifixion for Jesus.

- 1. Crucifixion was reserved for the vilest offenders.
- 2. It was a curse for a man to die on a cross (tree). See Gal. 3:13
- B. He died on that cross which really belonged to another. *Barabbas, a murderer, seditionist, robber. *Barabbas picture of all sinners who Christ died in their place.for
 - 1. Isa. 53:5 read, "for our transgression"
 - 2. Galatians 2:20 read, "gave himself for me"
 - 3. I Peter 3:18 read, "the just for the unjust"
