II. THE WONDERFUL CHARACTER. "The Great God and Saviour." v. いろ

2. God became man that man might participate in the Divine Nature. Heb. 3:14,  $2 \text{ Con } 5:2^{\circ}$ 

III. A WONDERFUL GIFT. "Gave Himself." V. 14
