

Allen Jones is a longtime Independent Baptist preacher best known for his leadership at Lebanon Baptist Temple in Lebanon, Ohio. He served faithfully as pastor for many years, guiding the church through a season of growth and stability.

In 1976, Brother Jones believed it would be wise to rename the church. Under his leadership, Calvary Baptist Church became Lebanon Baptist Temple, a name that reflected both its location and its firm Baptist identity. That change marked a clear direction and helped define the church's presence in the community.

After decades in the pastorate, Pastor Jones made a significant transition in 2008. He retired from his role as pastor and stepped into full-time evangelism, devoting himself to preaching, revival meetings, and encouraging local churches. This move followed a familiar pattern in Baptist life, where seasoned pastors take their experience on the road to strengthen other works.

Allen Jones is remembered for steady leadership, doctrinal clarity, and a heart for evangelism. His ministry reflects a lifetime spent serving the local church first, then continuing that calling through evangelistic work across churches that share the same faith and convictions.

In 2008, Pastor Jones made the decision to retire and go into full time evangelism.
